



Orange Grove Quilters Guild 2008 Block of the Month - May

IF USING YARDAGE

Color 1 (Medium) needs:

1 strip 2 1/2" x 5"

1 strip 4 1/2" x 9"

Color 2 (1st Dark) needs:

1 strip 2 1/2" x 5"

1 strip 4 1/2" x 9"

Color 3 (2nd Dark) needs:

1 strip 2 1/2" x 18"

Color 4 (Light) needs:

1 strip 5" x 20"

CONSTRUCT THE BLOCK:


- 1. First cut the Color 1 (Medium) 2 ½" x 5" strip into two 2 ½" squares. Then cut the Color 1 (Medium) 4 ½" x 9" into two 4 ½" squares.
- Repeat the above steps with the Color 2 (1st Dark) 2 1/2" x 5" and 4 1/2" x 9" strips.
- 3. Next cut the Color 3 (2nd Dark) 2 ½" x 18" strip into four 2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangles.
- 4. Then cut the Color 4 (Light) 5" x 20" strip into 16 2 1/2" squares.
- 5. Place a Color 4 (Light) 2 ½" square atop the left end of a color 2 rectangle, right sides together. On the back of the square mark the diagonal. Sew on this marked line. Cut off the excess seam allowance; press the remainder towards the other triangle.

= = =

Repeat this with another Color 3 (2nd Dark) square on the

opposite end. Make four of these.

6. Sew a Color 4 (Light) 2 ½" square to the left and right ends of each of the flying geese units just made. Sew one Color 1 (Medium) square to the left end of two of the previously made geese-plus-squares units; sew one Color 2 (1st Dark) 2 ½" square to the right end of these.



IF USING 5 INCH SQUARES

 Color 1 (Medium) needs:
 Color 3 (2nd Dark) needs:

 2 squares 2 1/2" x 2 1/2"
 4 - 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles

2 squares 4 1/2" x 4 1/2"

Color 4 (Light) needs: 16 squares 2 1/2" x 2 1/2"

Color 2 (1st Dark) needs: 2 squares 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" 2 squares 4 1/2" x 4 1/2"

CONSTRUCT THE BLOCK: Starting at step 5 complete the block.

- 7. Now sew the center unit/Four-Patch by joining a Color 1 (Light) and Color 2 (1st Dark) 4 ½" square. Join the other two Color 1 (Light) and Color 2 (1st Dark) 4 ½" squares. Sew these two units together to make the center.
- To the left and right sides of the center unit, sew one geese-plus squares unit.
- Now piece the block, as shown. Be sure to alternate pressing directions when adding pieces and rows.
