# KALEIDOSCOPE OF QUILTS AQCQUISITION


he Quilt Show is right around the corner. We're very proud of the gorgeous quilts and wearable art that will be on display this year.



# QUILT APPRAISER, ANNE COPELAND, TO OFFER APPRAISALS AT NOVEMBER QUILT SHOW

uring our quilt show November 2-3, Anne will be doing quilt appraisals for interested members. Verbal evaluations are free of charge.

Written appraisals are generally given for insurance purposes when entering shows, etc. and are \$45, but OGQG members will get theirs for \$35. Anne will take field notes and photos at the show, then send the typed and legal document in approximately 2 weeks. Appraisals are approximately 6-8 pages per quilt, sometimes up to 14 or more depending on the quilt and the information needed to accompany it.

Appraisals generally take 15 minutes per quilt, but some may take longer so appointments will be scheduled at 30-minute intervals. Prepare to line up a few minutes prior to your appointed time to keep the flow moving.

Ann will measure and photograph each quilt, front and back, take block measurements and detail photos. A description of each quilt is written to accompany the photos. She will need the following information to complete the appraisal: name, address, phone number, Email address and the name of the quilt.

When requesting an appraisal, please include the time and date you prefer and your name, email and phone number. Also, please designate if you would like a verbal or written appraisal.









