## June Speaker- Lura Schwartz Smith

This month we will have yet another excellent guest speaker and teacher. Lura Schwartz Smith comes from a background of illustration and graphic arts. She transferred from what she calls "bad bed quilts" to art quilts in the 70's in an attempt to merge her art background with quilting techniques.

Today she has won some of quilting's highest awards, including the "100 Best American Quilts of the 20th Century". She was part of the "30 Distinguished Quilt Artists of the World" exhibit in Tokyo in 2002.

Her slide talk "Journey of an Art Quilter" is retrospective of the development of her work over the years and details some of her recent techniques such as photocopying onto fabric and free-form curved machine piecing. .

Now that we are all inspired we can work on our auction quilts for our upcoming quilt show in Sept.

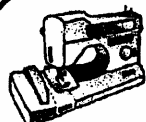

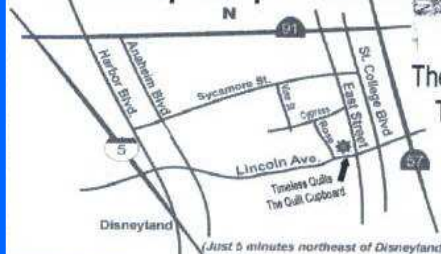

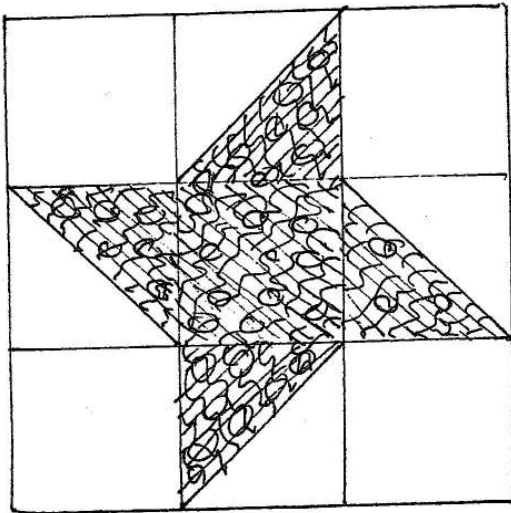

(8" block, 7½" finished)

For Memorial Day, Flag Day, Independence Day!

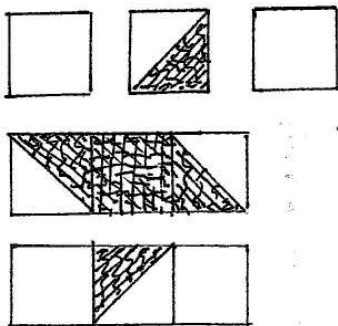


Let's do BRIGHTS!

For each block:

Cut: 4- 3" squares background  
4- 3" squares foreground  
2- 3 5/8" squares backgr.  
2- 3 5/8" " foregr.

To make 1/2 square triangles:  
Draw a line corner to corner  
on wrong side of all 3" squares  
of foreground fabric. Place  
one foreground square on top  
of each background square,  
right sides together. Stitch  
¼" on each side of each drawn  
line. Cut apart on drawn line.  
TRIM SQUARE to 3". Finger  
press.



Assemble as you would a  
conventional 9-patch.
